

Identity : Changing our identity, Stolen identity, Identity protection, new identity, witness protection of identity, building our own identity, celebrity identity, cultural identity, split personality....

1. Read/view material about the theme of identity, in general.
2. Choose one area in particular to learn about from researching. Form a question that you would like answered by your research.
3. Open a Google doc and type the question that you want to answer on the top of your page.
4. Find a minimum of Four sources to use in your report - each source must have an author or be a legitimate knowledgeable agency known to present accurate information. At least one source must be from EBSCO Host - found on the NorKam library page.
5. In a Google Document, copy and paste information from your source - or summarize in your own words, or both. What you copy directly, needs to have "quote marks" around it, so you do not make a mistake later thinking that they are your words to use.
6. At the top of your Google doc put the MLA citation for your source. Do this using EasyBib which you can find on the NorKam page Library link (see book icon)

DO NOT JUST COPY THE WEBSITE URL - THIS IS NOT ACCEPTABLE

7. Under the MLA Citation for your source, please write why you know that this is a legitimate source in full sentences. Eg. I know that the Canadian Psychology Association is a legitimate site because I Google searched the Association and it has been an independent body guiding Canadian Psychologists in Canada since 1939. Psychologists in Canada all join this association, so it must be legit.
8. Make notes about what you learned from each of the four sites/books/videos...
9. Prepare a report on what you found out and what the answer to your key question is.

This may be an oral report (those who have not done this yet, this is for you)
It may be a slide show, a cartoon, a Prezzi, a short play scene, a speech, an expository or persuasive essay with quotes, or....? Check with me about your choice if you are not sure that what you have chosen best fits the information that you found.

Your Research properly cited at the top of the page is 50% of your mark. The presentation of your findings is the other 50%.
